



- The one Bright Spot Mr. Hutchison born!






Political issues

- Nixon Administration landslide reelection with promise to end Vietnam conflict
- Government debt and the cost of war both hot & cold taking its toll
- Price inflation begins and wages start to fall



Watergate

- Watergate Hotel, DC
- o 1972 Campaign
- CREEP
- Special Investigation
- Perjury & blackmail
- 1974 Impeached
- Resigned in August
- Distrust of government& politicians



Gerald Ford 1974-1977

- VP Ford takes over, pardons Nixon
- "Caretaker" president
- Inflation continues, WIN program
- Tensions mount in the Middle East with Yom Kippur War



President Carter



- Jimmy Carter (D)
- Georgia governor
- Elected on moderate platform:
- Economic conservative
- Support for human rights stressed
- Friendship with Latin
 American countries –
 Panama Canal, highly criticized


Carter Continued

- Successes included the Camp David Accords effectively settling the Yom Kippur War
- Struggles emerged in relations with USSR and Latin America
- Energy policy largely seen as a failure




Iran Hostage Crisis

- Revolution against Shah and secular rule
- Carter's negotiation strategy disregarded issues central to Iran's revolutionaries
- 444 days before release
- Failed rescue attempts made administration seem incompetent



Cultural changes in America

- 1950's nostalgia
- Counterculture continues but begins to lose steam near the end of the decade
- Rise of consumerism and the "Me Generation"



The End of an Economic Era

- Employment and wages stagnated
- Prices and interest rates increased
- Vietnam war spending and no new taxes, deeper into debt
- Interest rates hit 21%
- Inflation hit 18% by 1980
- Average wages dropped by 14%
- o Poverty hit 15%

De-industrialization & Urban Blight




Domestic and Global Changes

- Rise of Japan and Germany
- oU.S. imports passed exports
- Deindustrialization
 - Eastern US factories closed
 - Moved south, southwest
 - Mexico and Maquiladoras
 - Union jobs declined
 - Layoffs, firings, etc

Oil Embargo

- Oil Producing and Exporting Countries
- Saudi Arabia and others refused to sell oil to U.S. due to its policies in Middle East
- Economic disaster, gas lines, riots
- Illustrated short-sighted policy based on non-renewable energy controlled by foreign countries




