4. How close to the actual course of events in the cold war was Orwell's prediction?
5. If the nuclear holocaust possible during the cold war is no longer our greatest threat, do governments use anything today to expand control over their populations and limit or suspend freedoms?

THE COLD WAR

BACKGROUND CONTEXTUALIZATION:

First signs of tension as WWII was winding down

Truman did not trust Stalin and Stalin and the Soviet Leadership felt taken advantage of during the war and became suspicious of the Western Allies

Stalin vowed never to let the Soviet Union be threatened again and plans for “total security” in Eastern Europe

COLD WAR

The Soviet Union began making moves to secure a “buffer zone” of nations under its influence in Eastern Europe.

Churchill gave the famous “Iron Curtain” speech (3/46) about these moves and Truman delivered the “Truman Doctrine” speech (3/47) promising aid to any country facing communist influence, specifically using the civil war in Greece as its first intervention.

In June of '47, the US announced the Marshall Plan. One year later, the Soviet Union started the blockade of Berlin.

US ACTIONS DURING THE COLD WAR

BACKGROUND CONTEXTUALIZATION:

During the Cold War, the ultimate goal was to defeat the Soviet Union and China – The communist superpowers

Every foreign policy choice was made with this guiding principle in mind

The US ended up making many controversial choices in the effort to achieve this ultimate goal

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

The US, the Soviet Union, and China compelled other nations to choose sides in the conflict

Choosing the “wrong” side could mean serious consequences

In order to secure the support of foreign governments the US engaged in illegal and unconstitutional activities, including assassinations and support for non-democratic governments

REGIME CHANGE

Major Assassinations and attempted assassinations carried out by the US:

Mohammed Mossadegh, Iran, 1953

Jacobo Arbenz, Guatemala, 1954

Patrice Lumumba, Congo, 1960

Fidel Castro, Cuba, 1960-???

(Documents suggest secret plans to assassinate Castro all the way through the Clinton Administration, 2001)
